In Memoriam: Kenneth Kobs

Cat Care Society lost a great cat lover, a generous supporter, and above all a good friend on April 29, 2017, with the passing of Kenneth Kobs after an extended struggle with cancer. Ken was a lifetime and passionate aviator, first as a fighter pilot with the Wisconsin Air National Guard and the U.S. Air Force (where he rose to the rank of Brigadier General), and then

as a commercial pilot and eventually captain with Delta Air Lines.

Ken retired from Delta at the end of 2016; but he and Susie remained active attendees at CCS events and other functions.

At our most recent Santa Paws, several staff and board members had the good fortune of meeting them for the first time. We were reminded on that occasion how much Ken and Susie (also a pilot) loved to “talk flying” and compare notes with other frequent travelers.

The photo of Ken in his camo—from his Air Force days—was taken in front of the plane he was boarding for his deploy-



ment to Iraq. Susie was justly proud of this photo. Ken was one of those rare people often described as “larger than life.” Everyone he met became a lifetime friend. Ken shared our love of cats and, as you can see from the photos, was a real Cat Daddy.

Ken and Susie were also CCS adopters, and have long been valued patrons of CCS. Their generosity had an especially large impact on Colorado Gives Day last December; it played a major role in CCS’s record-breaking success in that campaign.

Cat Care Society extends its deepest sympathies and respects to Susie Kobs. We all feel blessed to have known Ken, and we are grateful for such a shining example of grace and big-hearted friendship. The Kobs family are an ongoing inspiration to us in our work on behalf of cats and the people who love them. 🐾

Where Are They Now? *Happy Endings (One in a Series)*

From time to time we like to provide updates on some of our shelter cats. We have lots of happy outcomes for cats to tell you about—thanks to the generosity of donors like you. We have been able to give hundreds of cats a second chance at a life of quality, in a permanent loving home.

And cats for whom we have trouble finding homes stay with us—sometimes living out their lives with us—in a safe, friendly environment where we give them the best veterinary care, as well as lots of affection.



One of our favorite second-chance stories is about Jack (above) and Mack (below), two big black and white cats who lost one home, but went on to a new life in a completely different kind of residence.



These two brothers were born in a suburban Denver backyard in 2005. Their mom, a stray, had found a protected area under a bush to deliver her litter of four. The property owner cared for the mom and kittens inside. After several months, she brought Jack and Mack to Cat Care Society. They were adopted together four days later, and spent six happy years in the home of the adopting couple and their teenaged son.

But in July of 2011 Jack and Mack were returned to CCS—the family was struggling with an assortment of challenges and could no longer care for them.

Like many owner-surrendered cats, Jack and Mack both needed some extra veterinary attention. Jack was seriously overweight—almost nineteen pounds, at his peak—and both cats had to have several teeth pulled. This on top of the adjustments involved in suddenly living with 50 other cats. But their irresistible personalities prevailed, and they'd soon taken up residence on, and behind, the front desk in our shelter.

When any two cats living at CCS are closely bonded—especially litter mates—we won't separate them. It can take a lot longer to find a home for cats up for adoption as a pair (especially a couple of boys as big as Jack and Mack!). But one day a longtime CCS supporter came on the scene: Barbara D., business manager at the Libby Bortz Assisted Living Center in Littleton, was looking for a "house cat" to fill the void left when their unofficial cat mascot died. She and the home administrator fell in love with Jack and Mack, and the Libby Bortz Center soon had two house cats.

For nearly six years, Jack and Mack were the principal greeters at the center. As they had at CCS, they hung out a lot at the reception desk, and they were frequent visitors in many of the more than 100 apartments in the building. They became beloved by many of the residents as well as staff members. Barbara remained their primary caregiver and bonded deeply with them. They usually met her at the door when she arrived for work and raced her into her office. There they had favorite window perches (and often made themselves at home on top of

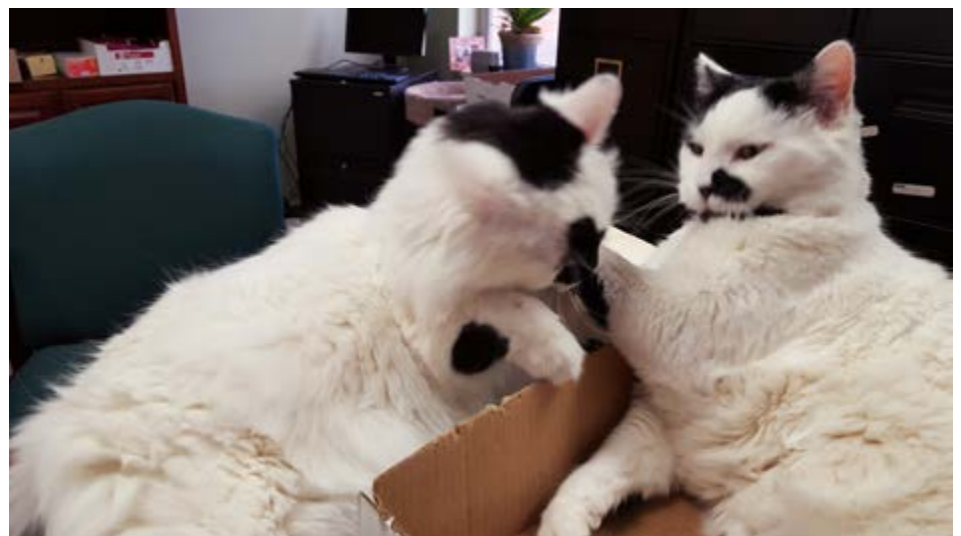
Barbara's desk!).

Then at the end of 2016, Barbara retired as business manager; and many other changes came to the Libby Bortz center. It became clear that another home would have to be found for Jack and Mack. Since the Cat Care Society will **always** take back cats whose homes can no longer accommodate them, they returned to CCS. They are once again comfortably residing in the shelter, this time in one of the cat rooms where only two or three other cats are kept and they have plenty of space to themselves. And staff and volunteers are again giving them lots of attention.

Jack and Mack will hopefully find a home with another loving family—they will always be paired—but meanwhile they are safe, well cared for, and given much loving attention every day. CCS never stops caring about the cats that come our way.

Jack's and Mack's story is a bit different from most. But they have continued to receive loving care, as have so many other CCS cats, only because of people like you who financially support our mission. And there are so many more cats like Jack and Mack, in need of the second-chance benefits of shelter, state-of-the-art veterinary care, and adoption into a loving home. **Since we receive no government funding**, all of our support comes from the community—generous people like you, who love cats. Can you help us now?

There are several ways to give your gift: send a check, or authorize a credit charge, using the enclosed envelope; drop off a



check at our Lakewood shelter; or donate online at catcaresociety.org. CCS can use ongoing monthly gifts as well as one-time donations.

Here are some of the ways your contribution will help...

- \$1,000 pays for 14 spays and 17 neuter surgeries, preventing 31 cats from giving birth to multiple litters of kittens.
- \$500 provides two cats with a year of medical care under our Perpet-U-Care program.
- \$250 buys three weeks' worth of litter for the shelter.
- \$100 covers two weeks' worth of antibiotics for five sick cats.
- \$50 buys blankets, cat toys and

food dishes to equip one of our cat rooms for six months.

The Cat Clinic Offers Expanded Services and a Knowledgeable, Dedicated Team

Dr. Goodrich and the Cat Clinic team continue to save lives!

Meet clinic patient Zoey! She was suffering from an abscess on her side that wouldn't heal. After Zoey visited several clinics her parents brought her to The Cat Clinic for another opinion. Dr. Goodrich jumped into action! Through diagnostics and a detailed exam, Dr. Goodrich discovered that the abscess had pierced the kitty's body wall. That very night, Dr. Goodrich and her team of talented vet techs performed emergency surgery to heal Zoey and save her life. Since her surgery, Zoey has been back to the Cat Clinic twice for her follow up appointments and she continues to make a full recovery thanks to Dr. Goodrich and the Cat Clinic team!



Meet clinic patient Wolverine! This sweet young man came to the Cat Clinic for treatment on a Saturday back in February. He came in with a broken leg but Dr. Goodrich quickly discovered he had ingested Tylenol. This could be fatal for cats. The Cat Clinic team immediately went to work with IV fluids and medication to flush Wolverine's system. We are thrilled to report, when Wolverine was

picked up by his family the next day his liver values were normal and he was able to have surgery on his leg by the orthopedic surgeon.

We are grateful that Dr. Goodrich saved Wolverine, but we are also grateful for his family. They love him dearly and they wanted their precious kitty to receive the critical treatment he needed to save his life. Together we made this happen for sweet Wolverine!

The Cat Clinic Offers Expanded Hours and Services

The Cat Clinic offers extended hours to include Saturdays and longer weekdays. On Saturdays we are open from 8:00am until 2:00pm. Tuesday through Friday appointments are available from 7:00am until 6:00pm.

We are committed to providing the highest quality care for your feline family. Since early 2016, we have expanded our veterinary services to include extended hours, in-house bloodwork, urine culture testing, ultrasound testing and Royal Canin prescription food. In addition, we offer additional surgery options, dental procedures using our digital dental X-ray unit, more efficient X-rays using our digital standard X-ray unit and specialized diagnostics with our in-house Ultrasound machine.

With our knowledgeable veterinary care team in place, our clinic equipment upgrades and our expanded services, we can serve you, our loyal and valued clients, even better! 🐾
